This community driven initiative is dedicated to encourage IPv6 deployment in the african region and to serve as a regional consolidated platform for knowledge and best practice exchange.

To achieve this objective the African IPv6 Task Force (AF6TF) divided its work scope in several Focus Groups to provide a more specialized approach and measurable targets. The Focus groups will work toward assisting different stakeholders in planning and deploying IPv6 on their networks and share knowledge and experience.

The AF6TF Focus Groups aim at supporting African stakeholders in defining clear roadmap for IPv6 implementation strategies as well as introducing IPv6 into African countries through education and capacity building.
